PIPE ORGAN PROJECT UPDATE

Associates, has met many challenges with skill and creativity. The organ's condition has made for a complex project, and is the composition of several different builders spanning over 200 years. While we discovered that most of the organ originally built by Krauss family had been replaced in the 20th century (as can happen due to damage, age, or other difficulties), we were happy to find that one rank of pipes likely dates to 1799, and some others to 1864! These pipes will receive new life again in

our organ upon its return, along with carefully selected pipes from the other eras of our organ and new ranks as well. The original casework made in 1797 from local pine is being carefully restored, and the various casework additions are being redesigned to match the Krauss' original style.

hile we have worked hard to treasure our heritage, the even more important goal of this project is to have an organ that fits the beauty of our church and the organ's role to lead us and future generations in praise to the Lord! We anticipate that the organ will be installed sometime

in the first half of 2024. Later in the year, we will hold a special concert when Bishop Schlert will come to bless and dedicate the organ.

A greenhouse was also donated and erected to help teach about how our food and plants grow!

my is an Independent Catholic School with a classical liberal arts curriculum. It is called independent because the school board, comprised of committed and talented parishioners, has complete and direct oversight over the school's operations, rather than the Diocesan Office of Education.

The only Catholic school in the diocese which has adopted the classical model, the Catholic liberal arts curriculum is decidedly light on technology, and places our students in touch with the great books of our civilization, the fine arts, and theology, while teaching the STEM disciplines as

While the pipe organ project is the centerpiece of our Restoration, many other improvements have been made and a few more are planned. So far, we have installed three new roofs: on the new school, the old school, and


